"The Free Ear Clinic Service for children will be at our school on Friday 1st of July between 8.30 – 3.30pm This is a drop in clinic for pre school and school aged children— no appointment is necessary, but all children must attend with a parent or legal caregiver

Visit the ear nurse if you have any concerns with your child's ears, for advice on glue ear, wax or foreign body removal, grommet checks, treatment of discharging ears.
